
THE DAILY NEWS FRONTIER

Prior to about 1970 the Colts did not participate in the Donovan Andree tournament. Its second-string players participated in the Daily News tournament which was a third-tier competition. An important source of information regarding the early Daily News teams is Mark Pereira who shifted between the first and second eleven teams throughout the fifties, playing wherever he was needed. In 1960 he was appointed Daily News captain and gave the team and the club his all until he left the country for Canada in 1965.

The news clippings in this chapter are mainly from Mark Pereira's archives and are limited to the Daily News games which Pereira participated in. There aren't that many descriptions of Daily News games of the fifties because Pereira was also involved in the first XI in the decade.

Mark Pereira opened the batting in the game against the ACSWS team and the opening bowlers were L da Silva and G.P. Schoorman, both first team contenders. The team also includes a useful bowler by the name of Jeronimus.

It is not known what ACSWS stands for. But all the players seem to be British. The ACSWS, Atomics and Casuals were defunct by the turn of the sixties.

Interestingly, the Atomics team include as many as six burghers. But SWRD is closing in. The Colts team includes Trevor Jansz who also played against the BRC. A Kretser scored an unbeaten half century for the BRC while T. Brohier scored a half century for the Colts. There was a Kretser in both sides. The V.S. Kretser in the BRC team is probably the person who joined the Colts straight after leaving Royal College in the late thirties and performed admirably for the club but left for the BRC. He was considered to be one of the greatest all round cricketers the country had produced prior to independence.

The following Daily News game against Aquinas took place about the mid-fifties. As schoolboys, Warwick de Kretser and B. van Geyzel rescued the Colts in a Daily News game against Aquinas. And de Kretser related how he and Lorenz Ebert did the same against the S.S.C. Warwick de Kretser hit C.I. Gunasekera for a six and his uncle Bertram watching him from sidelines was aghast at the possibility of him throwing his wicket away. An elated A.V. Fernando asked F.C. de Saram what he thought of the young Colts prodigies?

From now onwards material from the scrapbooks of Mark Pereira and Richard Alles are amalgamated. These clippings, while not necessarily describing games in sequence, and which are not comprehensive, nonetheless provide an insight into the people who had thrown in their lot with the club and ask questions about players who had good games.

The Daily News tourney gave cricketers at school valuable experience and many of them went on to acquit themselves in the Sara and Donovan Andree tourneys. One such person was Dickie Alles who kept a meticulous journal of news clippings relating to his playing days at the Colts. Although most of his records relate to the Sara team which he led thrice, his scrapbook also contains news clippings of Daily News games. He and his fellow Peterite Tyrone Le Mercier shone in many Colts Daily News games.



Mark Pereira was appointed captain of The Daily News team in 1960. He probably was in that position for about four successive seasons. He left for Canada in 1965.









Mark Pereira and Trevor Jansz were involved in the second XI games played in 1959 and 1960. Rauf Azzam, who had a long association with the club, played in some games. He also played cricket for the club throughout the seventies regaling players with his subtle humour.

One Visvanathan features prominently as an all arounder for the Colts. But he doesn't appear to have had a long stint with the club.

Sentil Sinniah played in at least one game for the club in 1959, and three games for the second XI in 1960, the season he captained Wesley. He must have left for England soon after. But he was in the team that won the trophy in 1966. There is more on him later.

Richard Alles and Tyrone Le Mercier were regulars between 1959 and 1961. Not unlike Sinniah they played for the club when not required by their school. Alles also represented the club in 1961, his last year for St. Peter's, when he was probably captain.

Le Mercier was adjudged best schoolboy bowler in 1960. But he didn't play regularly for the Colts first team throwing in his lot with the SSC after completing his school cricket career. What a difference he would have made to the outcome of the 1962-63 season. His final year with St. Peter's was 1963 and he joined the SSC where he played for a few seasons. In the mid-sixties Le Mercier, playing for the SSC, smashed the Colts, not with the ball, but with the bat.

Peterites Anghie and Brian Seneviratne played for the club in 1961. The latter also played in a Donovan Andree team which won a competition in the seventies. He was another unsung hero who threw his lot in with the club over a lengthy period.

Tita Nathanielsz made a comeback in 1961 and had modest success. He captured 2 for 20 in ten overs against Badulla. Badulla were outright victors in a low scoring and close fought game. The H. Aldons who opened the bowling for Badulla may have been an ex-Colt.

In the 1961-62 season one E. Schoorman is played for the Colts. He is very likely to be Everard Schoorman who captained Wesley in 1964. After leaving school he played for the BRC where his uncle Bobby was entrenched.

Interestingly, Darrell Lieversz opened the bowling for the Colts against the Negombo Olympians and captured 3 for 13. This was probably mid-season between Darrell's first and second school seasons.

In the game against the NCC, Darrell's Thomian counterpart in the season to come, Keith LaBrooy, took 4 for 24 off 27 overs. Schoorman also fired capturing 3 for 28. The batting was bolstered by big scores from the two reliables, Pereira and Jansz.

1962-63

The former Royal college opener V. Gowrishankaran played in all three games described below. His former captain Darrell influenced him to join the club soon after the 1962-63 school cricket season. Yet, he and people like L. Wimalaratne, Visvanathan, Layman and Geronimus never went on to make a long-term impact on the club at any level. But people like Neville Fernando and Rauf Azzam, both of whom played in the two games below, spent all their cricketing life bolstering the fortunes and morale of the second XI in yeoman fashion. They were led by Ranjit Samarasekera who played for the first XI in the 1962-63 season. Together they filled the vacuum caused by the departure of Mark Pereira and Trevor Jansz within a year of each other. Richard Alles was in the first XI and thanks to his records two substantial chapters have been developed on the 1962-63 first XI season.

According to the following three match reports the Colts won against Matara and the Catamarans and lost to the Anthonians. Wimalaratne had scores of 63, 68 and 49 and took wickets. Gowrishankaran struggled to get runs.

There was a Sarath Wimalaratne who captained Ananda in 1962. His brother played for Royal around 1960. But very little information can be downloaded on L. Wimalaratne.

If Mark Pereira got his seasons correct L. Wimalaratne is getting his runs while D. Lieversz is getting wickets to compensate for weak batting efforts. So, why wasn't L. Wimalaratne promoted to the first division?

Gowrishankaran also failed to get going in the few Sara games he played in. In 1962 he opened the batting for Royal and was third in the averages with a top score of 1962. In Royal's second innings against STC he scored a quickfire fifty and could have led Royal to victory if he wasn't felled by a cramp.

This underscores the vast gap between school and second division club cricket on one hand and first division club cricket on the other. The official recorder looked at the Donovan Andree batting averages for 1971-72 and remarked that those heading it, including the chronicler, were the national cricketers of the future. But the chronicler who played both first and second division cricket knew that this was a gross overestimation.

Similar gaps exist between county and state cricket on the one hand and test cricket on the other. Trevor Bailey in his plum in the mouth accent once commented that Denis Amis, while being a "gooood" county player was never really test class. Likewise, Cameron Bancroft, despite having two prolific state cricket seasons with the bat, was not recalled to the test team to take over Warner's opening spot. Bancroft looked very ordinary in the two tests he played against England.

But in fairness to Gowrishankaran he was giving priority to his accountancy studies and his commitment to cricket wasn't total. And he did make a few good scores playing for the Tamil Union, which he moved to on the urging of the then captain S.S. Kumar with whom he played for Royal under the captaincy of Darrell Lieversz.
