

The Colts played eight games, winning five - against Moratuwa, Moors, Tamil Union, BRC, Saracens) and losing three (University, NCC and SSC). It obtained an outright win against the Moors. The Colts influenced the final outcome by beating the BRC and smoothing the way for the NCC to take out the trophy.

As can be ascertained by the sequence of game reports in the scrapbook, and the reading of the accounts, the Colts played the eight games in the following order. University, Moratuwa, NCC, Moors, SSC, BRC, Saracens, Tamil Union.

The Colts lost two of their first three games. It lost to the University and the NCC but beat Moratuwa.

University

Satchitanandan was an off spinner in the Fuard mould. He had a knack of making the ball hold in the air which forced batsmen to mistime.

Aponso who opened for Moratuwa is likely be the Prince of Wales college captain who made a century against Royal in the third term of 1961. Royal lost that game by an innings.

R. de Silva could be the Royal cricket captain of 1955? The S.S. Jayawickrema isn't the Ceylon "Sargo" who played for the SSC.

The Colts of total of 111 was always going to be difficult to defend. The Crozier who captured 3 wickets captained Royal in 1956. He played for Ceylon in the Gopalan Trophy match in 1956–57, but did not play again until he was selected to tour Pakistan in 1966-67. In three matches Crozier took 14 at an average of 26.57. He took 6 for 135 off 64 overs in Pakistan's first innings in the first match, and 7 for 133 in Pakistan's only innings in the third match. He also top-scored with 57 as an opening batsman in the second innings of the second match. He was playing for the Donovan Andree team in the early seventies.

Kodituwakku, C.H. Gunasekera, Nanda and Lalith Senanayake represented Royal. C.H. Gunasekera and Nanda Senanayake captained Royal.

R.B. Wijesinghe, P.I. Pieris, Sarath Seneviratne and H.S.M. Pieris represented STC. The first three captained STC.

Kurukulasuriya is a former Trinity college captain. He scored 35 but it was Nanda Senanayake (65 n.o.) who enabled the SSC to recover from 7 for 122.

Bertie Wijesinghe captured 5 for 30 off 31.1 overs and scored 23. What is amazing is that he is 45 years of age, having been born on 24th May 1920. Of his fellow S.S.C. immortals, only C.H. Gunasekera was still playing in 1965-66. The other immortals are Sago Jayewickreme, F.C. de Saram, D.S. Jayasundera, Mahes Rodrigo, Ben Navaratne, Lucien de Zoysa and Robert Senanayake.

Bertie Wijesinghe was youthful and evergreen. Until he had a stroke in his early nineties, he never showed his age.

The chronicler visited him in March 2014. Despite having had a stroke he was quite articulate and cheerful.

C.H. Gunasekera is back in the SSC team after a stint at the Tamil Union. After being unable to hold his place in the SSC side he joined the Tamil Union. The chronicler recalls a classic century of his against the Colts at the Oval. Deft footwork, good timing and sheer elegance was the order of that innings. Tom Graveney couldn't have looked better.

C.H. Gunasekera was very bitter about the way in which the SSC treated him, and this comes across in chapter 18 of his book <u>Through the covers</u> which was edited by his family to soften its tone. For the 1963-64 season he was replaced by a medium paced bowler and a wicket keeper. He played two seasons with the Tamils. He was a member of the SSC team which took out the Sara trophy in 1966-67.
